How to Nominate a Charity?

Only members of the Greater Nashua chapter of 100 Women Who Care can nominate a charity. Members who wish to submit a charity for consideration must complete and submit a Charity Nomination Form. Nominations must be submitted and approved before the Facebook Live drawing the night before the scheduled event. Please refer to the criteria below to ensure that your organization meets eligibility requirements prior to nominating.

Eligibility Guidelines for Charitable Organizations

- Charities must be local and based in the Greater Nashua / Southern NH area.
- Charities must have a 501 (c)(3) status for a minimum of (2) years under the same name. Please do research to ensure this is the case. The organizations' websites and directors will be helpful resources in gathering the information requested on the form.
- Organizations who meet the 501(c)(3) requirements based on their "religious" purpose will not be eligible for consideration. 501(c)(3) religious organizations include churches, conventions and associations of churches, integrated auxiliaries of churches, nondenominational ministries, interdenominational and ecumenical organizations, and other entities whose principal purpose is the study or advancement of religion. This also includes schools that are under the umbrella of a religious organization for tax exempt purposes.
- Charitable Organizations must be able to provide charitable tax receipts for donations.

Other Charitable Nominations Details

- Each nominating member will have 10 minutes to present their case for selecting that charity for the group's donation – the timing includes Q&A from the membership.
- Presentations should be simple and not overly formal – we ask that you do not utilize PowerPoint presentations, handouts or other marketing materials. We are not an organization of professional fundraisers – we are simply a group of Women Who Care about our community.
- Charities that are not chosen are eligible for nomination for a future meeting. However, once a collective donation is made to an organization, it is not eligible for another nomination for three years.
